


Shah Hemchand Devchand, the epitome of philanthropy and social responsibility founded the Hemchand Devchand Charities Trust in 1968 and established HDCT Hospital, an Out Patient and Maternity Hospital in November, 1971, providing free medical services to all. After his demise in 1983, the management of the Trust activities was taken over by his like- minded sons, Sri Chandrakant H Shah, Sri Kantilal H Shah and Sri Dilipkumar H Shah as the Managing Trustees.


Ambika Sishu Kendra made a humble beginning in September, 1995. It is a Special School for the children diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities. Functioning in a barrier – free environment since August, 2009, the Centre has encouraged and taken up research and rehabilitation in order to achieve independent and interdependent living of the Special Children under its care. Therapeutic and academic services available are **free** for all. The Centre is run in four floors, with the plinth area of 5,600 sq. ft. in each floor. It is a unique school for the children with Special Needs in the entire Rayalaseema Region.


Ambika Sishu Kendra visualizes a society in which all the challenged individuals are an integral part. It drafts a goal- based programme towards self- help and employability for persons with disability to achieve satisfactory personal life and economic empowerment. Our Centre has so far served **5436** beneficiaries belonging to Kurnool district and the neighbouring districts. Presently there are **152** students in the Centre for Special Education, with an average of **30** cases attending the Out Patient Department every day.

At Out Patient Department, the child is properly diagnosed and assessed for a specific period before being admitted in to the Centre for Special Education. In some cases more than the therapy for the child, counselling is required for the parents for accepting and handling the Special Child. The statistical data furnished below details about the various services available at our Centre.









The above statistical details clearly emphasise the need for Early Intervention and Parent Counselling. The team at Ambika Sishu Kendra empathises with the parents of the Special Children and trains to work with them in the rehabilitation of the Special Child.



Early Intervention

Our main goal being the independent living for our children, they are thoroughly assessed and put in respective units of training based on their abilities and needs. The Open Learning Unit trains in academics, aiming to send them to open schooling in course of time. Various facilities and services are provided for realizing the dream of interdependence among our children. The following information highlights the provisions at our Centre.

A Safe Environment:

The Children at Ambika Sishu Kendra are housed in a very protective environment. Safety being the top most priority, we are on constant vigil. Our safety measures include-

- 1. Barrier-free environment.
- 2. Security watch round the clock throughout the year.
- 3. Visitors' Register to know about the people coming to our Centre.
- 4. CC TV surveillance to check any form of abuse.

Health Care Services:

The staff at Ambika Sishu Kendra work hand in hand with the parents in maintaining the health of the children. Free service in offered twice a week by Dr. Nagesh, Paediatrician, every Wednesday by the homeo doctors Mrs. Bhargavi and Mrs. Manjushree and once in a month by the reputed neuro-surgeon Dr. Seetharam. We also counsel the parents about nutrition, diet, hygiene and sanitation.

Self- Help for Independent Living:

The main focus at Ambika Sishu Kendra is to train the children in daily living skills so that they can lead independent lives to the satisfaction and relief of their parents and the caregivers.

Our children are trained in eating, drinking, dressing, toileting etc., so that as they grow up they can lead decent lives. Physiotherapists and the teachers work in co-ordination, train the parents and suggest suitable adaptations at home through home visits. Along with regular physiotherapy, mobility training is also given to achieve independent mobility in course of time in a barrier -free environment.

Education:

Literacy is encouraged in the early stages through sight reading and matching by giving verbal prompt and physical prompt if necessary. Based on the ability of the child, he/she is taught the alphabet, functional words, simple mathematics along with environmental awareness. Presently 4 children are enrolled in III class under Open Basic Education.

Computer Education:

We have introduced our children to the world of computers. They listen to stories and rhymes, revise the topics introduced to them in the class and the abled ones learn typing and the functions of different keys in the key board. For the children with difficulty in hand function, there are various adaptations also to facilitate their learning. We are happy that our adult children gave a power point presentation on 15th August 2015.

Speech & Communication:

Speech is a powerful and popular medium of expression. With most of our children being non-speaking and having many speech related problems, therapeutic programme is designed and executed to improve the vegetative functions and to enrich them with functional vocabulary. We are happy that around 60 children have crossed word level and they are communicating using complete sentences and narrating stories too. We also use the adaptive voice output devices such as Kathamala, Communication Board and Picture Books.

Physio Therapy, Sensory Therapy and Mobility:

Mobility and self-help being the major challenges for our children diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy and Physical Impairment, detailed assessment is done to devise the therapy for the child at school and necessary adaptations are suggested at home. Our children are trained in wheel —chair mobility in a barrier — free environment. Sensory training helps in reducing sensory issues.

Economic Empowerment:

Ambika Sishu Kendra aims at training the children towards economic empowerment. They are trained in pre-vocational skills and later in different vocations based on their abilities and needs. Activities like packing, weighing and sealing help not only in revising the academics but also help in improving concentration and working in groups. Preparation of paper bags, phenyl and files promote hand function. Apart from these, they are also trained in domestic chores so that they can be helpful at home and shall involve in useful work in their leisure time. Presently 13 children receive monthly stipend and many more are being trained.




Sad Demise:

Conclusion:


